The partners will present strategies for effective collaboration and for meaningful implementation of the CCGPS, including close reading of complex text and effective research, synthesis, and evaluation techniques for secondary students. Highlighted activities include the Identity Box and Learning Autobiography, culminating in a research-driven and text-based performance task.

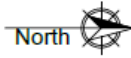

Take I-75 N toward MARIETTA / CHATTANOOGA.
Take the CHASTAIN RD exit, exit number 271.
Turn RIGHT onto CHASTAIN RD NW.
Turn RIGHT onto BUSBEE DR NW.
Turn RIGHT into the parking lot immediately past the KSU Center sign.

If you are coming from North of Kennesaw (Cartersville, Rome, Jasper, etc.)

Take I-75 S.
Take the CHASTAIN RD exit, exit number 271, toward I-575 N.
Turn LEFT onto CHASTAIN RD NW.
Move to your right hand lane on CHASTAIN RD.
Turn RIGHT onto BUSBEE DR NW.
Turn RIGHT into the parking lot immediately past the KSU Center sign.

OR

Take I-575 S.
Take the CHASTAIN RD exit, exit number 3.
Turn RIGHT onto CHASTAIN RD.
Move to your left hand lane on CHASTAIN RD.
Turn LEFT onto BUSBEE DR.
Turn RIGHT into the parking lot immediately past the KSU Center sign.
